


SECRET OF SUCCESS LIES IN DAILY ROUTINE

In addition to the market dynamics, we fell short against project timelines, techno-economic parameters and production targets that we set for ourselves leading to a sub-par performance.

In the past few quarters, SAIL has started seeing the beginning of a turnaround. The steel market has seen a recovery leading to better realizations while we have started a transformation across our functions - operations, sales & marketing and bringing our capital projects into production. While these efforts are a start towards a journey to transform. SAIL's fundamental unit economics and develop core capabilities for the future, there is a lot more to be done. The positive developments would not have been possible without your help and the integral role you have played in driving this transformation, something which you must continue to do in the months to come to make this transformation truly sustainable.

As I take charge of this office, I intend to build on this momentum and continue to drive the transformation of SAIL. My desire is to make SAIL an organization with robust capabilities that can withstand market vagaries in delivering value to its customers, employees and to the Nation. Over the next few weeks, I will work along with you in shaping the priorities for the organization and set the direction for my time at its helm. I have listed below a few preliminary thoughts on the immediate priorities:
